



AMBULANCE ATTENDANCE PROCEDURE

In the event an ambulance is required to attend a home ground fixture the following procedures will apply.

The Mandurah Mustangs Senior Sports Trainer or duly qualified person will make the decision on whether an ambulance is required on the field or at the clubroom's dependant on the seriousness of the injury.

On field Ambulance

1. The Trainer will call or appoint a committee person to call Ambulance on 000.
2. If an Ambulance is required on the oval, please relay the following information to the operator.
3. Ambulance required to Rushton Park Sporting Complex, the Ambulance will be required to enter the ground off **Clarice Street through the first set of gates (Gate 1) located closer to Dower Street.**
4. Mandurah Mustangs Executive Committee members and the Game Day Operations Manager all have a gate access key and will have a volunteer to open the gates and direct the Ambulance driver to the injured person.
5. The trainer is required to stay with the injured person till the Ambulance officers take over.
6. The club (preferably the trainer) will make efforts to contact the injured person's family (mustang's person) to notify them of the situation. If a family member of the injured person is not in attendance, if possible, assign a volunteer support staff member to accompany them to hospital.
7. Once the Ambulance has left the gates will be required to be closed.
8. Team Manager or Coach to inform the Executive Committee of the incident if they are not present.

Off field Ambulance

9. The Trainer will call or appoint a committee person to call Ambulance on 000.
10. If an Ambulance is required to the change rooms or off the field, please relay the following information to the operator.
11. Ambulance required to Rushton Park Sporting Complex, the Ambulance will be required to enter the ground off **Clarice Street through the first set of gates (Gate 1) located closer to Dower Street.**
12. Mandurah Mustangs Executive Committee members and the Game Day Operations Manager all have a gate access key and will have a volunteer to open the gates and direct the Ambulance driver to the injured person.
13. The trainer is required to stay with the injured person till the Ambulance officers take over.
14. The club (preferably the trainer) will make efforts to contact the injured person's family (mustang's person) to notify them of the situation.
15. Once the Ambulance has left the gates will be required to be closed.
16. Team Manager or Coach to inform the Executive Committee of the incident if they are not present at the ground.
